VILLA ROMA RESORT TO HOST THE 2019 SUMMER ROAMIN' TATTLER MUSIC FESTIVAL FILM FESTIVAL



With the 50th anniversary of the Woodstock Festival just around the corner, we at the Roamin' Tattler thought it might be appropriate to screen the films that celebrate the bands and festivals that were emblematic of the music of the late sixties era.

The criteria that we used in picking the films was quite straightforward. Naturally great music and performances were at the heart of the choices. Secondly, we tried to focus on presenting evenings featuring as many different performances onscreen by as many different performers as possible, rather than focus on an entire single performer's set (Jimi *Hendrix Live at Woodstock*, for instance). Finally, some movies and TV broadcasts were selected over others due to the fact that they conveyed the joyous rapture of the music of the time and, frankly, are a pleasant viewing experience. For this reason, *Gimme Shelter* the beautiful-but-brutal Maysles Brothers documentary about 1969's ill fated free Altamont Festival isn't included, although it is a brilliant film, and arguably the best of the bunch.

The ten films, some very rarely shown on the big screen, will be shown in Villa Roma's Marty's Lounge on Thursday evenings at 10:00 pm throughout the summer season. Please understand that due to the nature of the times fifty years ago, some salty language, mild drug use, and brief nudity may be present in some scenes in certain films...or not. So settle back, settle in, and let the sounds and the sights envelope you, and take you on a trip back to where it all began...

Featuring: Canned Heat, Eric Burdon & the Animals, Country Joe & the Fish, Simon & Garfunkel, Big Brother and the Holding Company with Janis Joplin, Jefferson Airplane, Hugh Masekela, Otis Redding, Ravi Shankar, the Mamas & the Papas, the Who and the Jimi Hendrix Experience.
- 2.) July 4: **A Night at the Family Dog** (1970) PBS Television. In concert at the Family Dog Music Hall on San Francisco's Great Highway Featuring: Santana, Grateful Dead, Jefferson Airplane, Group Jam. Plus **Go Ride the Music** (1970) PBS Television concert. JA in rehearsal, QMS live at Sonoma State University. Featuring: Jefferson Airplane & Quicksilver Messenger Service.
- 3.) July 11: **Rockin' at the Red Dog: The Dawn of Psychedelic Rock** Documentary: Howard Hessman narrator. Featuring music by Big Brother and The Holding Company, The Charlatans, Grateful Dead, Jefferson Airplane, Quicksilver Messenger Service and many others.
- 4.) July 18: **Rolling Stones Rock and Roll Circus** (1969) UK TV special: Jethro Tull, The Who, Taj Mahal, Marianne Faithfull, The Rolling Stones. The Dirty Mac (Eric Clapton, Mitch Mitchell, Keith Richards, John Lennon, Yoko Ono). Plus: **Dick Cavett Meets the Rolling Stones** (1972).
- 5.) July 25: **Concert for Bangladesh** (1971) Concert Movie: Madison Square Garden George Harrison, Ringo Starr, Eric Clapton, Bob Dylan, Leon Russell, Billy Preston, Klaus Voorman, Badfinger, Ravi Shankar
- 6.) Aug 1: **Fillmore** (1971) Concert Movie: The closing of the Fillmore West. Lamb, Cold Blood, Hot Tuna, Rowan Brothers, Quicksilver Messenger Service, Jefferson Airplane, New Riders of the Purple Sage, Grateful Dead, It's a Beautiful Day, Elvin Bishop Group, Santana, Bill Graham.
- 7.) Aug 8: **Festival Express** (1970) Festival Movie: A wild, cross country Canadian train trip, featuring: Grateful Dead, Janis Joplin, The Band, Buddy Guy, Flying Burrito Bros, Ian & Sylvia's Great Speckled Bird, and Delaney & Bonnie & Friends, Sha Na Na.
- 8.) Aug 15: **Woodstock** (1969) The mother of all Festival Movies: Joan Baez, Country Joe McDonald, Santana, The Who, Jefferson Airplane, Canned Heat and Joe Cocker, Santana. Crosby Stills & Nash, Richie Havens, Sha Na Na, Arlo Guthrie, Ten Years After, John Sebastian, Sly & The Family Stone, Jimi Hendrix.
- 9.) Aug 22: **Dick Cavett Show** (1969) TV: Day after Woodstock show interviews, music: Joni Mitchell, David Crosby, Stephen Stills, Jefferson Airplane. Also: Dick Cavett interviews Janis Joplin, musical performance.
- 10.) Aug 29: **The Last Waltz** (1976) Thanksgiving concert, Winterland, San Francisco, 1976. The Band says farewell to the road. The Band, Ronnie Hawkins, Bob Dylan, Paul Butterfield, Bobby Charles, Eric Clapton, Neil Diamond, Dr. John, Joni Mitchell, Van Morrison, Ringo Starr, Muddy Waters, Ronnie Wood, Neil Young, Emmylou Harris.
